

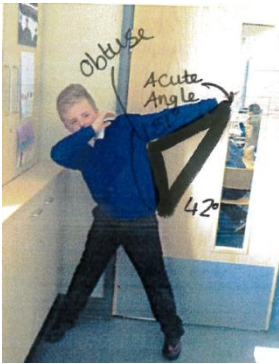

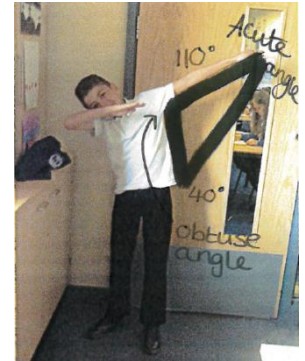

Site Security



As you may have noticed over the Easter holidays we have made several changes to our school site. We have installed fencing to separate the school sports field to allow ease of access for nursery parents and to prevent any distractions for children during lessons.

As you can understand the safety of our pupils and staff is paramount, therefore to ensure the safety of all pupils on site the school gates are closed and locked promptly at 9am. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause.

Attendance & Punctuality

As a school, we are aware lateness can severely affect achievement, education lays the vital foundations of a child's life. Regular and punctual attendance at school is key to both academic and social development, which in turn will improve the life chances of children and young people. We monitor punctuality closely and have strategies in place to address lateness. The school day begins at 8.50am and the doors close at 9:00am. Please make sure that your child arrives on time every day to ensure that your child is settled and makes good use of the morning. The children registered after 9.00am are considered late.



What does 90% attendance mean?

- 90% attendance = ½ school day missed every week!
- One school year at 90% attendance = 4 weeks of learning missed!
- Over 5 school years of school = ½ school year missed!
- All children and young people nationally whose school attendance is 90% or below are considered to be persistent absentees.

Online Safety

Online-Safety is an important part of keeping children safe at Oyster Park Primary School

We have extensive security measures in place in school to help safeguard pupils from potential dangers or unsuitable material. Any online-Safety incidents are recorded and managed in accordance with our online-Safety Policy. Online-Safety is taught to all pupils explaining and demonstrating how to stay safe and behave appropriately online.

We can only be successful in keeping children safe online if we work with parents to ensure the online-Safety message is consistent. It is important that parents speak to their children about how they can keep safe and behave appropriately online.

It's essential to be realistic - banning the internet or technology will not work and it often makes a child less likely to report a problem. Education around safe use is essential.

[CEOP](#) (The Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre) delivers a multi-agency service dedicated to tackling the abuse and exploitation of children in the real and 'e' world. Often it is referred to as an online 999. By clicking on the button, young people and parents can get advice on a range of issues such as viruses, hacking and dealing with bullying online.

Parental Controls

Qustudio is a free parental controls software download which allows parents to:

- Monitor chat
- Block harmful content from search results
- Limit the time spent online and on devices
- Restrict games or applications on devices
- Track a device
- See who a child calls or texts most
- Prevent access to mature or adult sites
- View and manage activities from anywhere
- Protect and monitor without children knowing
