What is attendance?

Attendance is the act of being present at something. For example you can:

Attend a birthday party



Attend a concert



Attend a firework display

Why is attending school important?

- School is your first and most important job. You are learning about more than Maths or English. You are learning how to show up for school on time every day, so that when you leave education and get a job, you'll know how to show up for work on time every day.
- School helps you to develop important skills, knowledge and values that set you up for further learning and participation in your community.
- If you attend school regularly you are more likely to achieve good GCSE results, continue on to further education and find a good job.
- Young people who are frequently absent from school are more likely to become involved in, or be a victim of crime and anti-social behaviour.









What is good attendance?

- 100% attendance is fantastic this means you attend school on time every day
- Northern Ambition Academies Trust Schools target is 96% attendance
- 95% attendance is when we start to worry
- 90% or below attendance becomes a persistent absence
